Continuing a trend for the past several years, Hamilton Township remains one of the regions fastest growing suburbs, having ranked #1 in Warren County for new home construction and number #4 in the region in 2018. Our police department continues to meet these demands, by being responsive to our citizens, priding ourselves on working with the community to improve the quality of life in our Township.

This year, voters overwhelmingly renewed our police department operating levy and our budget continues to be stable with careful monitoring of expenditures.

2018 marked the 25th anniversary of the Hamilton Township Police Department!

On August 4, 1993, Trustee Fred Oeder made the motion to form the Hamilton Township Police District, and along with Trustees Clyde Baston and O. T. Bishop, the motion carried. Now, 25 years later, our agency continues to grow, becoming more sophisticated and technologically advanced as our township continues to evolve.

We continue to lead the way for agencies our size with advanced training. Understanding a well-trained agency equates to lower liability and higher employee satisfaction, our agency's training commitment – led by Sgt .Terry Viel – is top notch. In addition to state-mandated training, our employees received over 1200 of additional training hours in advanced law enforcement training.

We continue to strengthen our partnerships with Federal, State, County, and Local Organizations by collaborating with the Warren County Drug Task Force, the Warren County Tactical Response Unit, the Warren County Safe Communities Coalition, and Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigations and Identification. Our agency's motto is simple: "*Guardian Heart – Warrior Spirit,*" Simply put, treat people with respect and dignity, while protecting yourself and the community. This philosophy and mindset helps to maintain a high level of

service delivery which this community has come to expect from its' police department. We will continue to remain on the cutting edge of law enforcement.

I am extremely proud of all the men and women who work for this agency!















Incidents are defined as both dispatched calls for service and self-initiated activity (i.e. vacation home checks and business checks)



2018 Most Frequent Calls for Service




Criminal Investigations Division

Sergeant Quillan Short leads our Criminal Investigations Division. Sergeant Short handled 67 criminal cases in 2018.





School Resource Officer




Officer (and Coach) Shane Brandenburg has been assigned






- Continued to increase our social media presence by adding an Instagram account
