

Wreaths Across America started as a simple gesture of thanks that has grown into a national movement of dedicated volunteers and communities coming together to not only remember the nation's fallen and honor their service, but to teach the next generation about the sacrifices made for us to live freely. This year, there will be more than 2,500 participating locations placing wreaths on National Wreaths Across America Day – **Saturday, Dec. 18, 2021** – with more than two million volunteers coming together.

The goal for **Civil Air Patrol, GLR-OH-145, Lt Col JP Ashman Composite Squadron** is to raise enough funds to place 273 veterans' wreaths on the headstones of all the local heroes laid to rest at three cemeteries in Hamilton Township, to ensure that the individuals who served to protect the freedoms of our country never be forgotten and to bring the community together in patriotic commemoration.

"We are forever grateful for the thousands of supporters who dedicate their time and effort to fulfilling our mission on a local level," said Karen Worcester, executive director, Wreaths Across America. A ceremony will be held on December 18<sup>th</sup> starting promptly at noon at the Maineville Cemetery. The wreaths will be then laid at the Maineville Cemetery. Volunteers will then proceed to the Murdock and Hopkinsville Cemetery to lay wreaths.
