-Presentation of the Proposed Annual Appropriations Budget

Mr. Cordrey explained that a vote will not be made on this tonight; this is just to open a discussion on it. A vote will most likely take place at the last meeting in October or the first meeting in November.

Mr. Rozzi mentioned that he just received this so he will review further and they can discuss it in the next few meetings.

Mr. Sousa expressed the same sentiments and mentioned that we should maybe consider reviewing it in a different manner for the taxpayers.

Mr. Cordrey pointed out that we have budgeted for the mitigation of Mounts Park.

Mr. Hickey commented that we have budgeted \$150,000 for next year. This year was all preliminary with paperwork. Next year the work will actually be done.

Mr. Cordrey also mentioned that there was a noticeable increase with the cemetery fund.

Mr. Hickey explained that the increase in mowing's for next season is the reason for the change.

### Fiscal Officer's Report

Mr. Weber gave the report for August stating that we are 67% thru the year 62.6% of the projected revenue has been received. We have not received the second draw from Warren County yet. Expenditures are 58.8%

Year-to-date, we have received a little over 7.5 million of the projected 12.1 million in revenue. Our appropriations are a little over 13 million and we have spent approximately 8 million of that.

We currently have a cash balance of 10.7 million. We will receive our second draw this month and will report on that next month.

### Administrator's Report

Mr. Hickey requested a motion to hire Part Time Fire Fighter/EMT Adam Gilpin.

Chief Reese explained that this hire does fall under the Resolution passed previously stating that we could move forward with certain hiring's. Mr. Gilpin will be starting with us this week at \$15.00/hr.

#### TRANSFER OF PROPERTY AGREEMENT

This Transfer of Property Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into on October \_\_\_\_\_, 2020, by and between **THE PRESBYTERY OF CINCINNATI**, an Ohio nonprofit corporation, successor in interest to Hopkinsville United Presbyterian Church, an Ohio nonprofit corporation ("Church") and **HAMILTON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES**, WARREN COUNTY, OHIO ("Hamilton").

### 1. Recitals.

- 1.1 Church owns the real property located at 131 W. Route 22 & 3, Maineville, Ohio 45039, as more particularly described on Exhibit A, including all improvements, appurtenant rights and easements thereto (the "Property"), including the Hopkinsville Cemetery located on the Property (the "Cemetery").
- 1.2 Church delivered a letter dated September 3, 1980 purporting to transfer the Property, including the Cemetery, to Hamilton, a copy of such letter is attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Letter"); however, no deed was recorded and legal title to the Property was not transferred to Hamilton.
- 1.3 Since 1980, Hamilton has, and continues to, maintain the Property, including the Cemetery located thereon.
- 1.4 Since 1980, the Church has neither maintained nor does it have (or is it receiving), any trusts, endowments, or other funds for the maintenance of the Cemetery.
- 1.5 Church wishes to legally transfer the Property to Hamilton and Hamilton wishes to accept such transfer from Church.
- **Agreement.** Upon execution of this Agreement, Church will convey fee simple title to the Property to Hamilton by quit claim deed, the form of which is attached hereto as Exhibit C ("Deed"). Hamilton agrees to record the Deed in the Warren County, Ohio Recorder's Office and pay for all conveyance fees, transfer taxes, and recording fees relating to the transfer of the Property. Church hereby relinquishes all rights to the Property, including, but not limited to, the right of reverter set forth in the Letter.
- 3. General. This Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between Church and Hamilton with respect to the Property. This Agreement may not be modified, altered, or amended in any manner except by an agreement in writing executed by the parties. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which will constitute an original and all of which counterparts together will constitute a single instrument. Signatures transmitted by email or other electronic means will be sufficient to bind the parties. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Ohio.

**FIRST:** The name of the corporation shall be GRACE COMMUNITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH,

**SECOND:** The place in Ohio where the principal office of the corporation is to be located is Morrow, Warren County, Ohio.

THIRD: The purpose or purposes for which said corporation is formed is to provide and maintain for the members of Grace Community Presbyterian Church, a place of worship of Almighty God and for instruction in the Christian faith according to the Book of Order and Book of Confessions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America; to promote the cause of the Christian religion and the interests of said church; to receive, hold and disburse gifts, bequests, and funds received from other sources, to own real estate; to construct own an lease buildings for places of worship an for manse; and to do any and all things necessary or incident to any of the foregoing purposes.

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2020, the Hamilton Township Board of Trustees passed Resolution Number 20-0902A Requesting Hamilton Township's Share of Funds from Warren County for Coronavirus Relief Distribution Funds as Legislated in the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, and Dispensing with a Second Reading;

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a respiratory disease caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is rapidly spreading across the world, and is twice as contagious and twenty times more deadly than the seasonal flu;

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the global outbreak of COVID-19 a public health emergency of international concern;

**WHEREAS**, on January 31, 2020, the White House declared COVID-19 a national public health emergency;

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine declared a state of emergency for the entire State of Ohio to protect the well-being of Ohio citizens from the dangerous effects of COVID-19 by suspending purchasing and contracting requirements contained in the Ohio Revised Code during the period of the emergency in order to procure necessary resources and supplies to protect the health, safety and welfare of Ohio citizens;

WHEREAS, as of March 18, 2020, the Ohio Department of Health confirmed that eighty-eight (88) Ohio residents tested positive for COVID-19;

- WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, President Donald J. Trump signed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security, or "CARES" Act into law;
- **WHEREAS**, the CARES Act created a Coronavirus Relief Fund appropriating \$150,000,000,000 for payments to States, Tribal governments, and units of local government;
- WHEREAS, through H.B. 481, the Ohio General Assembly is providing for the distribution of funds received by the State of Ohio pursuant to the CARES Act to local governments with certain restrictions, including the requirement that townships establish a local coronavirus relief fund; and
- WHEREAS, the outbreak of COVID-19 presents a true and public health emergency, resulting in the urgent and immediate need for political subdivisions to take emergency measures to protect the health, safety and general welfare of their residents;


