Trustee Board member, Mark Sousa, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Cordrey and Mr. Sousa were present.

Public Comments

Mr. Sousa opened the floor to public comments at 6:02 pm.

Mr. Rusty Holman came forward to speak. He referenced Mr. Warrick coming forward during the last meeting and asking for a tax holiday. Mr. Holman asked for the possibility of a tax holiday as well. He said the second thing he would like to talk about is the difficulty driving at night in the Township. He stated that the white and yellow lines need to be repainted. He wasn't sure if this is a Township responsibility or ODOT's responsibility.

Mr. John Roesch came forward to speak. He mentioned it has been a while since he has been at a meeting but hopes to become for involved. He welcomed Mr. Pegram as the new Administrator. He stated his first comment is that he is here to support what Mr. Holman said. He stated he is a precinct captain, he is trying to reengage the precinct captains to be more involved in local matters.

Mr. Sousa stated before he closes the floor he would like to address the concept of a tax holiday. He stated the monies for the Township really falls into four categories, General, Public Works, Fire and Police. We know that we want to build two new roads that are development related. We believe those road estimates could be in the neighborhood of 6-8 million dollars. We could deplete all the ARPA monies and take any extra cash we could possibly take out of the General Fund and Public Works that is set aside for roads and it would bring those funds to the 9 months reserve. Then with the purchase of a new ladder truck within 24 months, if we pay cash would bring our reserves for Fire Department down to 7-8 months. We are now talking 3 or our 4 main departments in that reserve sweet spot. Police Department now is at 10-11 months reserves. We fully hear you guys and I am willing to talk to you more about it. We plan to resolve the excess reserves as these projects come up. Mr. Sousa mentioned if there is a thought out there that we are over collecting from residents and do not know what we are going to do with the monies, I believe that is an inaccurate assessment.

Mr. Cordrey mentioned that he is not going to rehash what he said last meeting but Mr. Sousa said it well. I think that we are a growing community, house are still going up left and right. We

are trying to see what resources we will need going forward. If that is additional Officers, additional Fire crew/EMS crew or infrastructure.

Mr. Sousa mentioned a conversation he had with another local elected official in the past 12 months. He stated we on average still get mutual aid in our Fire Department every day. He had this elected official ask him how it is fair that the tax payers in his jurisdiction service and pay for calls in your jurisdiction for your Fire Department.

Mr. Sousa closed the floor to public comments at 6:18 pm.

Human Resources

Ms. Allgeyer stated she will have two motion requests that she will speak on this evening.

Ms. Allgeyer explained both MOU's, Effective pay period for pay increase(s) to be first full pay period in January, instead of 1-1-2023. This prevents us from having to do two time sheets and two payrolls the first week of the New Year and brings all collective bargaining units and non-union employees into compliance.

Ms. Allgeyer then explained the second MOU for the Hamilton Township IAFF Local 4055. She stated it is for Military Leave and bringing it into policy with State and Federal Law.
