Public Comments

Mr. Rozzi opened the floor to public comments at 6:01 PM.

Mr. Marvin Stotz commented on the Hawthorn Manor HOA's requirement for sidewalk repairs and recommended a local company for the work. He also inquired about the detour plan for the upcoming Stephen Road Bridge replacement project, expressing concern that Village of the Green, Hawthorn Manor, and Regency Park may experience increased cut-through traffic. Administrator Wright explained that the County has issued a detour route that prioritizes state and county roads, making it more suitable for residents. Mr. Sousa added that while some additional neighborhood traffic is possible, navigating through the subdivisions would likely be slower and more difficult than following the County's recommended detour. Mr. Stotz concluded his comments by expressing his appreciation for the new Kroger on State Route 48.

Mr. Brad Turner raised concerns regarding overgrowth at the corner of Talon Road and Zoar Road, as well as a Providence resident's concern about fence posts being placed within a drainage easement. Mr. Turner was directed to contact the County Storm Water Department regarding the fence issue. Mr. Wright also noted that he or Public Works Director Pelfrey would follow up with the County about the overgrowth.

With no further comments, Mr. Rozzi closed the public comment portion at 6:13 PM.

- The Police Department command staff is working with event management to ensure a safety plan for golfers, visitors, and River's Bend residents.

Mr. Cordrey announced that the Public Works groundbreaking ceremony will be held on Monday, September 8, at 9:00 a.m. between the Administration/Police Department building and Station 76. He noted that no RSVP is required and invited the community to attend and celebrate the occasion.
