Guest Speaker- Hazard Mitigation Plan, Warren County Emergency Management Agency

Sydney Renner, with Warren County Emergency Management, addressed the Board regarding the 5-Year Plan and expressed hope that the Board would approve the resolution at tonight's meeting. Mr. Rozzi and Mr. Sousa stated they had no questions and thanked Ms. Renner and her team for the detailed information provided in the 5-Year Plan packet. He proposed arranging a face-to-face discussion with District 55 State Representative Michelle Teska to review these three proposed amendments and to also bring attention to HJR2.

Fiscal Report

Mrs. Leah Elliott provided the July Fiscal Report with the following updates: As of the end of July, which is 58% through the year, the final appropriations/expense budget was \$18 million, with expenditures totaling over \$9.6 million, or 53%. The Public Works Fund shows revenue collected at 89.1% year to date; however, this is elevated due to the new building payment received. The true percentage collected is 57.4%.

Mr. Sousa noted that Mr. Wright has received the TIF presentation for the Kroger property. Mr. Wright requires clarification on certain data and will provide that information to Ms. Elliott.

Administrator's Report Mr. Wright reported:

County Road Projects

• Nunner Road between OH-48 and West Road will close Thursday, August 28 (weather permitting) for paving. Work scheduled to avoid school/work commutes. Managed by Warren County Water and Sewer (513-695-1377).

• Stephens Road will close between Hargus Drive and Village Green Parkway for about 12 weeks for a bridge replacement project by JTM Smith Construction under the Warren County Engineer's Office. Updates will be shared on social media.

Recreation Updates

- Mounts Park Stream Restoration: meeting Friday to review bid timeline; awaiting USACE permit.
- Veterans Fish n' Float: September 12 at Mounts Park. Free event for 50 veterans/active service members and a guest. Fishing, kayaking, lunch, gear, fishing license, shirt, and rod/reel included.
- Movie in the Park: August 22 at Testerman Park. Games at 7 pm, Little Giants at 8:30 pm. Concessions, Krimmer's Pizza (cash only), and free popcorn from Regal Cinemas.

- Mock accreditation by Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services produced very positive results. HTPD on track to be among the first 25 agencies in Ohio to achieve full accreditation this year.

 Progress continues on replacement vehicles: ladder truck, pumper truck, and re-chassis of an ambulance.
