#### Fiscal Officer's Report

Mr. Weber stated that this is the financial report for November. We are 92% thru the year. We have received 108% of our anticipated revenue. We have spent 76% of our budget. Our budget appropriations are almost \$14.9 million and we have spent approximately \$11.4 million. We currently have an overall cash balance of a little over \$14.1 million.

Mr. Cordrey questioned if property taxes have been impacted at all.

Mr. Weber explained that they have not really been a problem for us.

#### Administrator's Report

Mr. Hickey explained that Chief Reese is working with One Stop Signs for the new Fire Station sign at the front of their station.

Chief Reese also gave a brief update on the Assistant Fire Chief position. The process began with 5 candidates that were assessed through Agenbroad and Associates. After that 3 candidates moved on to the panel interviews with the Department Heads. Two of those candidates are up for consideration but Chief Reese is not ready to make an announcement yet. There are a few final details to get through before the individual will come in to meet the Trustees.

Mr. Hickey stated that we are staying on track with the CARES Act funding and getting everything scheduled.

Lastly, we want to wish everyone in Hamilton Township a Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays!

#### **Trustee Comments**

Mr. Rozzi wished staff and residents a safe and Happy Holidays.

Mr. Sousa thanked all that applied and pursued one of the Zoning positions. He echoed Mr. Rozzi's sentiments to enjoy the Holidays with family and friends and stay safe.






