This is the final step towards the Kroger TIF and the start of construction for the public infrastructure related to Kroger and Towne Center Blvd.

30-Year \$4,300,000 TIF

The Warren County Port Authority is issuing the bonds for this project.

Kroger is entering into an agreement with the Port Authority to serve as the Construction Manager at Risk for both the public and private improvements.

The Port Authority will issue bonds, Kroger is purchasing bonds.

Bonds will fund the TIF fund, TIF fund will pay for all public infrastructure improvements to Towne Center, Grandin Road etc.

The entire Hoptown TIF district at projected build out will generate an estimated \$9,348,000 over the 30-year period, additional funds may be used for additional infrastructure improvements within the TIF district.

Once the TIF generates a Debt Reserve fund of \$375,000 we will pay the Little Miami School District back \$1,273,000

Andy Brossart from Bradley Payne, who is handling the financing of TIF bonds, is here to answer any questions related to financing the Board of Trustees may have.

# HAMILTON TOWNSHIP, WARREN COUNTY, OHIO RESOLUTION NUMBER 23-0517A

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT AMONG THE WARREN COUNTY **PORT** AUTHORITY, HAMILTON TOWNSHIP, THE KROGER CO., AND THE HUNTINGTON NATIONAL BANK; AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR PAYMENT OF DEBT SERVICE WITH RESPECT TO NOT TO EXCEED \$4,300,000 OF PORT AUTHORITY REVENUE BONDS TO BE ISSUED TO PAY COSTS OF PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS; AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY CONSTRUCTION MANAGER AGREEMENT **AND** INCREMENT FINANCING AGREEMENT AND CERTAIN OTHER AGREEMENTS AND DOCUMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE REVENUE BONDS; DISPENSING WITH THE SECOND READING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Hamilton Township, Warren County, Ohio (the "Township") intends to collaborate with The Kroger Co., an Ohio company (the "Company"), to provide for the construction, equipping, and improvement of certain public infrastructure improvements on real property located within the boundaries of the Township (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Township to request the assistance of the Warren County Port Authority (the "Port Authority") in financing the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority will issue revenue Bonds (the "Bonds"), the proceeds of which Bonds will be made available to the Company for reimbursement of the Project, as further described in the Cooperative Agreement to be entered into by and among

the Port Authority, the Township, the Company, and The Huntington National Bank, as trustee (the "Cooperative Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Township Board of Trustees has determined to authorize the signing of the Cooperative Agreement, the Construction Management Agreement, and the Tax Increment Financing Agreement, all in connection with the Project.

NOW, THEREFOR, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Resolution constitutes and is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare, and for the further reason that the Township Board of Trustees desires the Cooperative Agreement to be effective within the current calendar year with respect to a particular parcel in order to maximize the amount of Service Payments available to pay the costs of public infrastructure improvements in order to protect the public morals, safety, and health, and to promote the public convenience and common good of the Township; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Trustees of Hamilton Township, Warren County, Ohio that:

**SECTION 1.** <u>Determinations by Board of Trustees</u>. The Board of Trustees of the Township find and determines as follows:

- a) Public Purpose. The Project serves a proper public purpose under Article VIII, Section 13, of the Ohio Constitution.
- b) Cooperation with Port Authority. It is necessary, proper and in the best interest of the Township to request the Port Authority to issue the Bonds and for the Port Authority to make the proceeds from the issuance of the Bonds available to the Corporation and the Township pursuant to the Cooperative Agreement for use in the Project.
- c) Cooperative Agreement, Construction Manager Agreement, and Tax Increment Financing Agreement. It is necessary, proper and in the best interest of the Township to authorize the Cooperative Agreement, the Construction Manager Agreement, and the Tax Increment Financing Agreement to provide for, among other things, the issuance of the Bonds by the Port Authority.

The Board of Trustees of the Township find and determine that the issuance of the Bonds and the signing and delivery of the Cooperative Agreement, the Construction Manager Agreement, and the Tax Increment Financing Agreement in connection with such issuance for the purpose provided in this Resolution serves a proper, public purpose.

SECTION 2. <u>Authorization of Cooperative Agreement, Construction Manager</u>
<u>Agreement, and Tax Increment Financing Agreement; Additional Documents.</u> In connection with the issuance of the Bonds, the Township Administrator is authorized, in the name and on behalf of the Township, to sign and deliver the Cooperative Agreement, the Construction Manager Agreement, and the Tax Increment Financing

Agreement in such form as determined by the Township Administrator and the Township Law Director as acceptable, in the best interest of the Township, and consistent with this Resolution.

The Township Administrator is authorized to sign and deliver and accept delivery of such instruments, certificates and documents as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions authorized by this Resolution, including all agreements, contracts, and documents necessary or appropriate, in such officer's discretion, to facilitate the purchase of the bonds or the advance of proceeds of the Bonds by the bondholder or procurement of bond insurance to enhance the credit of the Bonds if determined to be advisable in connection with the pricing and sale of the Bonds.

The Township Administrator is further authorized to provide certain information related to the Township (the "Township Information") for inclusion in an official statement or other offering document of the Port Authority, in preliminary and final form, in connection with the original issuance of the Bonds. If the Township Administrator so determines, then the Township Administrator and the Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized and directed to prepare, on behalf of the Township and in their official capacities, the Township Information and any supplements thereto, and such certificates related to the accuracy of the Township Information as may, in their judgment, be necessary or appropriate.

The Township Administrator is authorized to make the necessary arrangements on behalf of the Township and cooperate with the Port Authority to establish the date, location, procedure and conditions for the delivery of the Bonds to the original purchaser of the Bonds identified by the Port Authority and to take all actions necessary to effect due signing, authentication and delivery of the Bonds by the Port Authority consistent with the terms of this Resolution. The Fiscal Officer or other appropriate official of the Township shall, upon request, furnish the original purchaser of the Bonds identified by the Port Authority a true transcript of proceedings certified by the Fiscal Officer or other official.

**SECTION 3.** Revenues Received by the Township. The Board of Trustees authorizes the Fiscal Officer or other appropriate official to take all actions necessary to effect the Cooperative Agreement, including but not limited to the transfer of funds held in the TIF Fund in accordance with the Cooperative Agreement.

NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING IN THIS RESOLUTION TO THE CONTRARY, THE TOWNSHIP'S OBLIGATION UNDER THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT TO TRANSFER FINANCING PAYMENTS SHALL BE A SPECIAL OBLIGATION OF THE TOWNSHIP AND SHALL BE REQUIRED TO BE MADE SOLELY FROM THE ASSIGNED SERVICE PAYMENTS DEPOSITED BY THE TOWNSHIP IN THE TIF FUND. THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE TOWNSHIP UNDER THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT ARE NOT AND SHALL NOT BE SECURED BY AN OBLIGATION OR PLEDGE OF ANY MONEYS RAISED BY TAXATION. THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE TOWNSHIP UNDER THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT DO NOT AND SHALL NOT REPRESENT OR CONSTITUTE A

DEBT OR PLEDGE OF THE FAITH AND CREDIT OR TAXING POWER OF THE TOWNSHIP, AND NO ENTITY HAS OR WILL HAVE ANY RIGHT TO HAVE TAXES LEVIED BY THE TOWNSHIP FOR THE PAYMENT OF FINANCING PAYMENTS.

**SECTION 4.** Federal Income Tax Matters. The Port Authority may determine to issue its Bonds, in one or more series or sub-series, as obligations the interest on which is excludable from gross income for purposes of federal income taxation ("Tax Exempt Bonds") pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and regulations duly promulgated under the Code, as amended (the "Regulations"). If any of the Port Authority's Bonds are issued as Tax Exempt Bonds, the Fiscal Officer or his or her designee, for and on behalf of the Township, is hereby authorized to: (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation, choice, consent, approval or waiver on behalf of the Township with respect to all or such portion of the Bonds as permitted or required to be made or given under the federal income tax laws, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting favorable tax treatment or the status of all or such portion of the Bonds or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing any rebate amount or any payment of penalties, or making any payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, any excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by the Fiscal Officer or his or her designee, which action shall be in writing and signed by the Fiscal Officer or his or her designee, on behalf of the Township; (b) to take any and all actions, make or obtain calculations, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the Township, as may be appropriate to assure the status of all or such portion of the Bonds as Tax Exempt Bonds; and (c) to give an appropriate certificate or agreement on behalf of the Township for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings setting forth the facts, estimates, and circumstances, and reasonable expectations of the Township pertaining to Section 148 of the Code and the Regulations, and the representations, warranties, and covenants of the Township regarding compliance by the Township with Sections 141 through 150 of the Code and the Regulations, as applicable.

To the extent proceeds of any Bonds issued as Tax Exempt Bonds are held or controlled by the Township, the Fiscal Officer or his or her designee shall keep and maintain adequate records pertaining to the use and investment of all proceeds of any Bonds issued as Tax Exempt Bonds sufficient to permit, to the maximum extent possible and presently foreseeable, the Township and the Port Authority to comply with any federal law or regulation now or hereafter having applicability to any Bonds issued as Tax Exempt Bonds that relates to the use of such proceeds, limits the amount of bond proceeds that may be invested on an unrestricted yield or requires the Port Authority to rebate arbitrage profits to the United States Department of the Treasury. The Fiscal Officer or his or her designee is hereby authorized and directed to cooperate with the Port Authority to file such reports with, and rebate arbitrage profits to, the United States Department of the Treasury, to the extent that any federal law or regulation having applicability to any Bonds issued as Tax Exempt Bonds requires any such reports or rebates.

The Township hereby covenants that it shall comply with the requirements of all existing and future laws which must be satisfied in order that any Bonds issued as Tax Exempt Bonds are and will continue to be Tax Exempt Bonds, including, without limitation, restrictions on the use of the property financed with the proceeds of such Bonds and restrictions on the use of the proceeds of such Bonds in such manner and to such extent, if any, as may be necessary, after taking into account reasonable expectations at the time such Bonds are issued, so that they will not constitute arbitrage bonds under Section 148 of the Code and the Regulations. The Fiscal Officer or his or her designee is, are hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of the Township and on its behalf, to execute and deliver a Tax Compliance Certificate or similar certificate or agreement (the "Tax Compliance Certificate"). The Tax Compliance Certificate shall be in such form and shall contain such terms, covenants and conditions not inconsistent with this Resolution as shall be approved by the Fiscal Officer or his or her designee. The approval of the Tax Compliance Certificate shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution thereof by the Fiscal Officer or his or her designee.

**SECTION 5.** <u>Interpretation</u>. Nothing in this Resolution is intended to, and no provision hereof shall be applied in any manner as would, impair the obligation of contract of the Township with respect to any outstanding bonds, certificates of indebtedness, other obligations, indentures, or other agreements or contracts made or entered into by the Township.

**SECTION 6.** Severability. Each section of this Resolution and each subdivision or paragraph of any section is hereby declared to be independent, and the finding or holding of any section or any subdivision or paragraph of any section to be invalid or void shall not be deemed or held to affect the validity of any other section, subdivision or paragraph of this Resolution.

**SECTION 7.** Compliance with Open Meeting Law. The Board of Trustees finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121,22.

**SECTION 8.** Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective from and after the earliest period provided by law.

**Budget Impact:** The cost of this project is currently estimated at \$50,000 and the Township's share would be \$18,747. The maximum grant funds available are \$31,253. If our application for the NatureWorks Grant Program is approved, it is a reimbursement-type program, so the Township would pay the entire project cost upfront, and then be reimbursed \$31,253 under the program.

The costs for this Project would be paid out of the 2024 General Fund – Contracted Services.

This resolution is adjusting appropriations for two projects both related to our parks.

- 1. Transfer of \$50,000 to the NatureWorks Grant Fund for the grant application for Testerman Park, agencies who have already appropriated funds receive 6 additional pints for their grant application.

### **EXHIBIT A**

- 1. All plans and proposals from the applicant shall be made conditions of approval unless modified by one of the following conditions.
- 2. Compliance with the Warren County Subdivision Regulations, the Hamilton Township Zoning Code, the Warren County Thoroughfare Plan, and the PUD Stage 1 conditions of approval (Resolution # 14-0507B).
- 3. Prior to construction, the applicant shall furnish the Engineer's Office with a set of stormwater calculations. An as-built survey of the basin must also be furnished demonstrating that it was built per plan.
- 4. Automotive service shall be performed and conducted inside the building.
- 5. All vehicles or parts shall be kept inside a building or screened from view of persons on contiguous property or persons using public rights-of-way, except that parking of vehicles on the lot for a period of time not to exceed 72 hours is allowed.
- 6. An Earth Disturbing Permit from the Ohio Department of Transportation will be required for any utility crossing State Route 48.
- 7. A right-of-way permit from the Ohio Department of Transportation will be required for any utility crossing State Route 48.
- 8. The water mains, hydrants, and ancillary components within the development shall be privately owned and maintained.
- 9. The applicant shall contact the Warren County Health District regarding plumbing permits prior to construction.
- 10. The applicant is permitted to have 35 parking spaces at the Property.
- 11. Interior traffic calculation shall be subject to a written review by the Hamilton Township Fire Department.
- 12. Sidewalks shall comply with Section 7.7.1(A) of the Hamilton Township Zoning Code and require a minimum width of 4' sidewalk along the frontage of State Route 48.
- 13. The modifications for the landscaping plan as discussed to rearrange some trees to screen the side of the building facing State Route 48.
- 14. Compliance with all Warren County partner organization conditions.
